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

2021 Monthly Load Factor




2022 State Legislative Priorities

Transportation Budget Requests

US Highway 12-

Funding for completion of the four-landing of U.S. Highway 12. Phase 7 was funded through the Connecting Washington Package. Phase 8, the final and most dangerous portion of the highway, is yet to be funded. It is a critical project for the increased safety and freight mobility along the 11 mile stretch.

US Highway 12/ Clinton Interchange-

Funding for a federal match on the diamond interchange at the intersection of US Hwy 12 and Clinton Street. The project would provide safe north-south crossing for pedestrians, cyclists, and traffic.

Policy Requests

Reauthorization of .09 Economic Development Sales Tax Program

Support HB 1333 to extend the local sales and use tax for pubic facilities in rural counties until December 31, 2054.

Public Works Assistance Account

Support for funding/protection of the Public Works Assistance Account (Public Works Board) and expansion of program to allow Ports to access their funds.

Small Business Protection and Retention

Support legislation that reduces regulatory burden and costs to small businesses.

Multifamily Property Tax Exemption

Broaden the scope of RCW 84.14 multi-unit dwellings tax exemption to include all cities. Currently you must be a mandated fully-planning city to receive the exemption.

Reauthorize and Expand Sale & Use Tax Deferral for Manufacturing Facilities

The high unemployment county sales & use tax deferral program for manufacturing facilities expired July 1, 2020. Reauthorize the program and expand to include rural counties defined as "Counties with the population density of less than 100 persons per square mile and a county smaller than 225 square miles."

Prevent Prevailing Wage Expansion

Oppose legislation expanding the definition of "public works" to include private entities receiving certain tax credits or leasing land from public entities. This type of legislation would harm our ability to partner with private sector entities to promote job retention and growth.

Unfunded Mandates

Ensure new legislation passed does not include unfunded mandates for local governments.

PRA Requests

Provide local governments additional opportunities to recover costs associated with public records requests.

CERB Support

Fully fund CERB's Request for additional funding.

Walla Walla County

Walla Walla County Courthouse

\$2 Million

The Walla Walla County Courthouse Complex has recently been audited by the Department of Homeland Security to help the County in its goal to ensure that all its citizens have safe access to public services and the courts. The county is seeking aid to make much needed ADA and security updates that will provide one fully accessible main entrance to the courthouse and allow for screening of anyone accessing the Courts. Secure access to the adjacent alleyway and restrict access through the eight alternate entrances to the courthouse building.

♦ E-911

\$1 Million

The County of Walla Walla's E-911 dispatch and emergency management headquarters have been re viewed by the Department of Homeland Security. Chief among the concerns presented to the county are vulnerability to natural disasters in its current location, including catastrophic flooding from an adjacent creek, and earthquake vulnerability both from the age of the building and its location next to a 13-story brick building. The County of Walla Walla in partnership with the surrounding cities and towns is seeking aid in funding the renovation of a building located high above the flood plain, and away from the historic downtown which presents numerous earthquake and security risks. These improvements will help ensure that the County's central disaster recovery location is prepared to assist the region during any catastrophic natural disaster and ensure that the new space design meets the needs of the growing county and region.

City of College Place

Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvement -

\$5 Million

The City must invest over \$25 million dollars over the next two years to satisfy new conditions of a state wastewater permit.

• SW Mojonnier Rd (Bluvue Lane to College Avenue) -

\$3.2 Million

Funding for the construction rebuild of Monjonnier to urban standards including sidewalks and utilities.

PORT Port of Walla Walla

+ East Attilia, Peterson and Nunn Road -

\$850,000

Pave roadways on East Attalia, Peterson and Nunn Road to encourage development at Wallula Gap Business Park, creating more living wage employment opportunities for the large minority and low income population in our region.

Wallula Gap Business Park Development, Phase 2 -

\$1 Million

The Wallula Gap Business Park is a 1,400+ acre heavy and light industrial zoned industrial park in need of additional infrastructure to provide services to current businesses and manufacturing leads. Phase 2 includes the development of water distribution lines to deliver potable water to Packaging Corporation of America (PCA), the Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) and other potential business leads on the south end of the Port's Attalia Water Service Areas within the Urban Growth Area (UGA).







2022 FEDERAL LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

U.S. Highway 12 - Phase 8

Funding for U.S. Highway 12 four-laning Phase 8. Total federal funding needed for construction is \$201.8 million. State has already earmarked \$7.6 million for design and right-of-way acquisition.

Seek Phase 8 placement on the Federal Highway Administrations Projects of National and Regional Significance. Work with congressional delegation to have project listed as a Tier I or Tier II project.

U.S. Highway 12 - Clinton Interchange

Funding for the U.S. Highway Clinton Street Interchange. Total federal funding for construction is \$40 million. Project will construct an interchange to provide full access at Clinton Street to enhance safety, community connectivity, economic vitality and provide a safe and full access for freight mobility.

Full Support of the River Navigation System, including Full and Proper Maintenance of the Columbia and Snake River Dams

The Columbia and Snake River navigation system is critical infrastructure to the Pacific Northwest economy. Full protection of the navigation system is paramount to the continued economic vitality of the Pacific Northwest. Proper ongoing maintenance ensures the longevity of the system and will allow for continued use and benefit of the inland waterway.

Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant

Funding for the construction of a new regional wastewater treatment facility that will serve region. As our communities grow, there is greater and evolving demand on our current systems, creating the need for the development and construction of a new regional facility.

E911 Improvements

Walla Walla County's multi-agency E911 Emergency Telecommunications Facility has been identified as a targeted damage site, as it lies in the collapse path of a multi-story brick structure that could render the site a total catastrophic loss to emergency services, dispatch personnel, law enforcement capabilities, and public access to requests for fire, emergency medical services, and rescue. A new location would need to be seismically retrofit and renovated for the purposes of an Emergency Operations and Communication Center, including all new radio, cell, broadband and satellite telecommunications. This would increase the regions emergency capabilities resiliency.

Walla Walla County Courthouse

The County's Historic Courthouse Complex is both the operational and visible seat of County government. The Courthouse, built in the early 1900's, has been maintained and upgraded over the last 100 years to afford accessibility of services to the public. With the ongoing implementation of the American Disabilities Act, and in an effort to keep its historic architecture preserved for future generations, the County has recently undertaken a master planning project to identify and target the modernization and renovation needs of the Courthouse to ensure the safety, accessibility, and resiliency of the Courthouse Complex. The County has requested a threat analysis from DHS/CISA on the physical resiliency of the complex.

Wallula Gap Industrial Park Development

The Wallula Gap Industrial Park is a 1,900+ acre heavy and light industrial zoned industrial park that is in need of infrastructure installation in order to provide services to the manufacturing leads that have shown interest in this property. The property is properly zoned but lacks the necessary infrastructure to compete with other national sites. The infrastructure needs include: Expansion of a potable water system to include storage reservoirs, additional wells for reliability and redundancy, fire flow capacity for large manufacturing facilities, process water delivery system, wastewater disposal system (large storage reservoirs for land application) and the construction of a roadway network system to serve the industrial park.

Mill Creek Channel (Not a federal request, just a progress update)

Federal Funding for the "General Investigation Study" by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has been secured. The non-federal sponsor funding requirement has been secured to complete the G.I. Study. Continue to seek federal funds for completion of the locally preferred plan, once developed, as a result of the completion of the G.I. Study.

Commercial Air Service (Airlines Support)

Keep congressional delegation updated on Alaska Airlines marketing and retention efforts. Port/Airport may want to start exploring another Small Service Community Air Service Grant for a second outbound destination.

Airport Improvement Program – Local Match

Small rural airports like Walla Walla Regional Airport are having a hard time coming up with its approximate 10% local match requirement for FAA projects. For instance, the Walla Walla Regional Airport completed a taxiway repair project in fiscal year 2017/2018. The project cost \$14.0 million. With the current 90/10 funding formula the airport will need to provide \$1,400,000 in local cost share. This would deplete the Airport's entire reserves. Would like to have the funding formula for small airports reduced to 95% Federal and 5% local.
